

VOTER INSTRUCTIONS

1 INITIALS

- Check to see if your ballot has been initialed by an election official and is ready for your vote.
- Initials of the election official have to appear on the ballot for it to be valid.
- If your ballot has been initialed, proceed to step 2. If your ballot has not been initialed, return it to an election official for a new ballot.



Scan the QR code to view the full text of statewide ballot measures or ask an election official if you would like to read them in their entirety.

2 VOTE

- Using a black or blue ink pen, completely darken the ovals next to your choices. It is very important that you color in the oval completely. Do not make an X or other mark.

Not Acceptable

- To vote for a write-in candidate you must blacken the oval and write the name on the line provided.
- When voting a political party ballot in the June election, you must vote along party lines. If you split your vote between the political parties, your ballot will not count for those races. This does not apply to no-party races or measures.
- You can vote for as many or few contests or races as you choose.

3 REVIEW

- If you make a mistake while voting, return your spoiled ballot to an election official to receive a new one. You may receive up to two additional ballots. The third ballot must be cast as voted.
- Review your ballot to ensure that you have completely filled in the ovals by all your choices.

4 SCANNER

- Take your completed ballot over to the ballot tabulator and place the ballot into the ballot feed. If you need assistance, please ask an election official for help.
- The scanner will check your ballot and let you know if you have made an error. If you have made an error, you may receive a replacement ballot up to two times. The third ballot must be cast as voted.
- When the scanner accepts your ballot, your vote is cast and your voice is heard in this election!
