PETITION TITLE

The initiated measure would amend North Dakota Century Code § 39-21-39 to allow motor vehicle window tint light transmittance to be at any level an individual chooses it to be for the windshield, as well as front and rear windows. It also would allow for any color or transparent design to be applied to any of the windows.

FULL TEXT OF THE MEASURE

IF MATERIAL IS UNDERSCORED, IT IS NEW MATERIAL WHICH IS BEING ADDED. IF MATERIAL IS OVERSTRUCK BY DASHES, THE MATERIAL IS BEING DELETED. IF MATERIAL IS NOT UNDERSCORED OR OVERSTRUCK, THE MATERIAL IS EXISTING LAW THAT IS NOT BEING CHANGED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Amendment. SECTION 39-21-39, subsections 2, 4, 5. of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

39-21-39. Windshield - Must be unobstructed and equipped with wipers - Tinted windows.

1. A motor vehicle must be equipped with a windshield. An individual may not drive any motor vehicle with any sign, poster, or other nontransparent material upon the front windshield, side wings, or side or rear windows which obstructs the driver's clear view of the highway or any intersecting highway.
2. The windshield on a motor vehicle must be equipped with a device for cleaning rain, snow, or other moisture from the windshield, which must be constructed as to be controlled or operated by the ~~driver~~individual of the vehicle.
3. The windshield wiper upon a motor vehicle must be maintained in good working order.
4. ~~An individual may not operate a motor vehicle with any object, material, or tinting displayed, affixed, or applied on the front windshield or any window unless the object, material, or tinting in conjunction with the windshield upon which it is displayed, affixed, or applied has a light transmittance of at least seventy percent or the object, material, or tinting in conjunction with a window other than the windshield upon which it is displayed, affixed, or applied has a light transmittance of at least fifty percent.~~ The window tint light transmittance of the windshield, front windows (driver/passenger) and the rear windows (behind the individual operating the motor vehicle) shall be at any level the individual chooses it to be. Also, included, any color or transparent design applied onto any of the windows shall be at the individual's choice. This subsection does not apply to windows behind the ~~operator~~ individual if the motor vehicle is equipped with outside mirrors on both sides that meet the requirements of section 39-21-38.
5. ~~Subsection 4 does not apply to nonreflective sun screening or window tinting material above the AS-1 line or within the top five inches [12.7 centimeters] of the windshield.~~

SECTION 2. Reference. SECTION 39-21-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is used as reference and understanding to the above Section:

39-21-38. Mirror.

On and after January 1, 1964, every motor vehicle, operated singly or when towing any other vehicle, must be equipped with a mirror so located as to reflect to the driver a view of the highway for a distance of at least two hundred feet [60.96 meters] to the rear of such motor vehicle.

INSTRUCTIONS TO PETITION SIGNERS

You are being asked to sign a petition. You must be a qualified elector. This means you are eighteen years old, you have lived in North Dakota thirty days, and you are a United States citizen. All signers shall also legibly print their name, complete residential address or rural route or general delivery address, and the date of signing on the petition. Every qualified elector signing a petition must do so in the presence of the individual circulating the petition.
