## **VOTING EQUIPMENT**



All 53 counties use the same equipment for statewide elections.

Voting equipment is extensively tested and certified by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission before being approved for use in U.S. elections.

### **TESTING**

All ballot tabulators are tested before every election to ensure they are 100% accurate.



Test results are cleared and the equipment is locked and sealed with a unique number until polls close on election day.



Election officials verify the unique seal numbers to ensure equipment has not been tampered with before polls open.



Ballot tabulators and the ExpressVote ballot marking devices are NOT connected to the internet and contain no components for such a connection.

## **VOTER ID LAW**

#### **VALID ID:**

- ND Driver's License
- ND Non-Driver ID
- Tribal ID or Letter
- Long Term Care Certificate



#### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- U.S. citizen
- 18 years old
- Lived in ND & your precinct for 30 days

VOTER ID LAWS & THE CENTRAL VOTER FILE ENSURE 1 PERSON = 1 VOTE.

No matter how you vote — absentee, early, or on election day — your ID is verified and records statewide are updated to ensure 1 person = 1 vote.





This happens within minutes through PollPads connected to all polling locations using a secure, encrypted, private network.

## **BALLOTS**



North Dakota only uses paper ballots, creating an auditable paper trail of all votes cast.



Ballots are never handled by equipment with an internet connection.



Cast ballots are always transported in the presence of nonpartisan officials.

## **ELECTION RESULTS**

Results are collected and recorded by the nonpartisan election board once polls close and are securely transported to the county auditor for final reporting. Results are verified on multiple levels and are not official until certified by the state canvassing board.
